Photography enthusiasts and JNBS partners made the December 9, 2014 coffee-table book launch a grand culmination to an 11-year project.

Stewart Reeves, chief volunteer photographer and processor of much of the book's photographs, shared with Youthlink, "Last year we had over 1,200 images submitted to us and there were approximately 300 at exhibition standard ... when professional photographers get down to one-third that is when they are really hitting it on the head, so these students are doing very well. Jamaica has a great reservoir of creativity within our young people. The thing is, photography adds to their life and interpretation of Jamaica."

Reeves shared with his captive audience that they have been asked to implement a similar programme in London as there is


