Lewis has also partnered with All Things In Common Shop My Closet, a business that collects and sells second-hand female, male and children's clothing items and accessories through donations and on consignment.

Kaydeen Wildman, co-founder of All Things In Common Shop My Closet, said, "I find Dress for Success Jamaica to be an inspiration, which has motivated me to do what I do. Therefore, it is a pleasure to partner with the social enterprise, and I'm really pleased to see the idea for the pop-up shop coming to fruition."

Lewis thanked Wildman and commended JN Bank for supporting the initiative and permitting the social enterprise to hold the event on its premises in Half-Way Tree.

JN Bank employees will also use the occasion to inform customers at the pop-up event about its products, such as its Partner Plan; Wealth Optimiser Savings Account; and Supersized Loan, the most affordable loan being offered for the holiday season.
